What is Extra COVID SNAP?

During the COVID-19 public health emergency, Rhode Island households received extra COVID SNAP around the 3rd of each month to buy food.

Due to federal action, the last extra COVID SNAP issuance was February 3, 2023.

How will this impact my SNAP benefits?

Starting in March 2023, you will get only 1 monthly payment. That is your normal benefit. You recently received a letter telling you the amount of your regularly monthly benefit.

Reminder: Unused SNAP benefits roll over each month. Change the PIN on your EBT card regularly to protect your benefits.

You may be able to increase your normal SNAP benefits by telling DHS about:

- Medical costs over \$35 a month for anyone in your SNAP household who is 60 or older or has a disability,
- If your housing costs have gone up (rent/mortgage), and
- Child or disabled adult care costs.
