In accordance to Rhode Island General Laws (RIGL) 42-35, notice is hereby given that the Department of Human services proposes the following DHS State Plan:

### **2024-2025 Community Services Block Grant Program (CSBG)**

The Community Services Block Grant provides funds to the State of Rhode Island and, in turn, Community Action Agencies to address the reduction of poverty, revitalization of low-income communities, and empowerment of low-income families and individuals to become fully self-sufficient. Rhode Island's Community Services Block Grant is administered by the Department of Human Services.

A public hearing will be held to consider the proposed plan on Thursday, August 17, 2023, 10:00AM, at the RI Department of Human Services, Louis Pasteur Building (Bldg. #57), 25 Howard Ave. 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Cranston, RI 02920 in the West Wing Conference Room. The hearing will begin at 10:00 AM and will conclude when the last speaker finishes testimony or at 11:00 AM, whichever comes first. The RI Department of Human Services, Louis Pasteur Building is accessible to the handicapped.
